Israel Story: "Herzl 48" Radio Show

Called "the Israeli This American Life," by NPR radio host Ira Glass (who should know - he's the host of This American Life), Israel Story is an award-winning radio show that showcases the diversity and complexity of everyday Israelis. They're coming to the J with their live multimedia storytelling and musical performance in celebration of Israel Independence Day.

There are 54 streets in Israel named after Theodore Herzl, the father of modern Zionism. "Israel Story" crisscrossed the country, knocking on the doors at every 48 Herzl Street they could reach and collecting the residents' stories (48 comes from 1948, the year Israel was founded). The show features seven different characters, including a butcher in Akko, a stoner in Tel Aviv, and a young couple whose very dramatic tale is told in song.
