Coordinated by Chava Monastersky and Alison Sands. The second night of Pesach we are commanded to begin counting the Omer until Shavuot. The 7 weeks between Pesach and Shavuot is both an agricultural festival marking the barley offering and the first wheat offering at the ancient Temple. It is also a spiritual journey. We are given an opportunity spend 49 days from leaving slavery on Pesach to choosing freedom at Shavuot. The Midrash teaches at "*Mt. Sinai the entire world was silenced, no wind, no birds, no sounds and GOD spoke to each of us in whatever voice we were able to receive.*" We will do a little study and sit in sacred silence as we prepare to hear God speaking.
