Michael Ramos serves as Executive Director of the Church Council of Greater Seattle. The Church Council collaborates with partners from all faiths throughout King and South Snohomish Counties to address homelessness and low-income housing, work for economic justice and uphold and affirm the rights and dignity of all immigrants. Most recently, he has helped convene congregations for rapid response and the creation of just immigration policies in the spirit of the Sanctuary Movement of which he took part in the 1980s in Seattle.
