Walk With Us: Stories from the Center for Jewish Non-Violence - A Post-Kiddush Lunch Discussion with Chava Monastersky and Rainer Waldman Adkins

In May, seven Seattle Jews, including current and past Beth Shalom members joined the 2017 Center for Jewish Nonviolence delegation of 150 Jews from nine countries in a coalition with Israeli and Palestinian organizations. Working in the West Bank and East Jerusalem, we built relationships and learned about the complexity of everyday Palestinian life. These activities culminated in the creation of Sumud Freedom Camp in the South Hebron Hills, an act of nonviolent civil disobedience. We will share why we chose to join the Jewish delegation, and the questions, and concerns we have since our participation.
