Walk With Us: Stories from the Center for Jewish Non-Violence - A Post-Kiddush Lunch Discussion with Chava Monastersky and Rainer Waldman Adkins

Shabbat, 7/29, 1:15pm in the Beit Midrash

In May, seven Seattle Jews, including current and past Beth Shalom members, Chava Monastersky, Rainer Waldman, and Joel Migdal, joined the 2017 Center for Jewish Nonviolence delegation of 150 Jews from nine countries in a coalition with Israeli and Palestinian organizations. Working in the West Bank and East Jerusalem, we built relationships and learned about the complexity of everyday Palestinian life. These activities culminated in the creation of Sumud Freedom Camp in the South Hebron Hills, an act of nonviolent civil disobedience. We will share why we chose to join the Jewish delegation, and the questions, and concerns we have since our participation.

It is traditional on Tisha B'Av to refrain from eating, drinking, engaging in sexual relations, bathing and wearing leather shoes. The study of religious texts is limited to those which enhance and reflect the day's mood such as the books of Lamentations and Job and other texts referring to the destruction of Jerusalem. Going to work, using money, driving and other restrictions applicable to Shabbat and festivals are not applicable to Tisha B'Av.

Punishment & Teshuvah from the Perspective of Jewish Prisoners Shabbat, 8/5 from 1:15pm in the Beit Midrash

Asaf Erez and Shirah Bell will lead a discussion on dealing with moral and religious issues regarding Jewish prisoners in modern times. How do we combine Halacha and compassion according to Jewish law?

Both of them teach at Monroe DOC and are on the Board of JAPA (Jewish American Prisoners Association) which has been created to support incarcerated Jewish prisoners in Washington; assist their families in coping with their traumatic experiences; provide Jewish materials to those incarcerated; and assist them with finding jobs and accommodations after their release.
