Northwest Immigration Rights Project (NWIRP).

Jorge L. Barón has served as the Executive Director of
NWIRP since April 2008, having previously worked as a
NWIRP staff attorney, serving immigrants detained at the
Northwest Detention Center in Tacoma.

Jorge's passion in advocating is rooted in his own
immigrant experience. Originally from Bogotá, Colombia,
he immigrated to the US at the age of thirteen.

Jorge graduated from Duke University & spent 5 years
working in the film industry before receiving his law degree
