Mohammed Al Samawi - To Save the World: A Harrowing Escape, an Unexpected Hero and the Power of Friendship Thursday, 5/24 from 7:00pm at Congregation Ezra Bessaroth, 5217 S Brandon St, Seattle

Born in Yemen, Mohammed Al Samawi was a devout Muslim raised to think of Christians and Jews as his enemy. After connecting with Jews and Christians on social media, and at various international interfaith conferences, Mohammed became an activist, making it his mission to promote dialogue and cooperation in Yemen. Then came the death threats: first on Facebook, then through terrifying anonymous phone calls. To protect himself and his family, Mohammed fled to the southern port city of Aden. As gunfire and grenades exploded throughout the city, Mohammed hid in the bathroom of his apartment and desperately appealed to his contacts on Facebook. Miraculously, a handful of people he barely knew responded. Over thirteen days, four ordinary young people worked to save this innocent young man trapped between deadly forces— rebel fighters from the north and Al Qaeda operatives from the south.
